Ayurvedic management of kitibha kushta (plaque psoriasis) with virechana and siravedha chikitsa - a case study

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Abstract-

Psoriasis is non-infectious. a inflammatory disease of the skin. characterised well defined bv erythmatous plaques with large, adherent, silvery scales. The main abnormility in Psoriasis is increased epidermal proliferation, due to excess proliferation of cells in the basal layer and a shorter cell cycle time. The transit time of keratinocytes through the epidermis is shorterened and epidermal turnover time falls from 28 to 5 or 6 days^[1] In ayurveda skin disorders have been described in Kushta Adhyaay, which further divides skin diseases in two broad categories i.e mahakushta and kshudra kushta. This paper highlights a case study of Kitibh kushta treated with avurvedic shamana chikitsa and shodhana chikitsa (Virechana and Siravedha)

INTRODUCTION-

Sapta dhatus like Tridosha and Twak, Rakta, mansa, Lasika are involved in the Manifestation of Kushta Vyadhi. [1] Kitibha is one of the Kshudra kushta mentioned in Ayurveda scriptures by our Acharyas having symptoms like Shyava, Kina, Khara sparsha, Parusha. Ruksha pidika. [Kitibh Kushta has a dominance of Vaat and Kapha Doshas. [2]

Plaque psoriasis is the most common type. Indivisual lesions are well demarcated and range from few millimetres to several centimetres in diameter. The lesions are red with dry, silvery-white scaling, which may be obvious only after scraping the surface. The elbows,knees,and lower back is commonly involved. Other site include Scalp, Nails, Flexures, Palm, Napkin area. Factors causing Flare-ups are Trauma, Infection, Sunlight, Drugs, Emotions like Anxiety.[3]

A 44 year old Male patient who was apparently normal before 2 years, developed a small skin lesion over Right lower limb and back region. right lower limb lesion was associated with severe itching, erythema, and thickened flakes. Psoriatic lesion on the back had white scaly lesion with redness,tenderness,swelling. Patient was earlier on Allopathic Medication but discontinued the medication after taking it for one month as he couldn't get any relief from symptoms, Later he consulted our opd for Hospital Treatment.

Probable mode of Action-

- Amapachana dravya help to reduce the Aamavastha and attain a state of Niramavastha which helps in increasing the efficiacy of Shodhan chikitsa like Vaman, Virechana, Basti. [8]
- Snehana help in the Shithilikarana of doshas and Swedana Ushna guna Liquifies the doshas and bring doshas from Shakas to Koshta^[9]
- Acharya Vaghbhat has mentioned vamana ,virechana

- and Siravedha chikitsa in the treatment of Kustha Roga. [10]
- Doshas Accumulated in the Koshta is eleminated through the body with the help of virechana.
- Siravedha helps in Raktaprasadan, pacifies the Kapha pitta doshas present in blood

Discussion-

- Psoriasis can be corelated to Kitibh kushta a type of Ksudra Kushta mentioned in the Ayurvedic text having Dominance of Vata and Kapha dominance.
- Patient had an habit of Apathya ahar vihar sevan like Adhik
 Mansa sevana , Ratrijagarana, Adhika chinta leading to Kitibh Kushta
- According to lakshanas and nidana Ayurvedic Management like Aampachan, Virechana, Siravedha and Shamana aushadi was given

Conclusion-

- This case study demonstrate the effective management of *Kitibh kustha* with *shodhana* therapy like *virechana* and *siravedha* along with *shamana chikitsa*
- The Psoriatics area and the flakiness was significanty reduced after the shodhana and shamana chikitsa
- The PASI Score was reduced from 6.3 to 3
- Siravedhan chikitsa helped in pacifying the pitta doshas and

significantly reduced the symptoms like itching and prevented flareups
